- Star-Spangled Banner author Francis Scott Key (August 1, 1779) was born in Frederick County, Maryland. After witnessing the British bombardment of Fort McHenry on the night of September 13-14, 1814, he was enthralled to see the American flag still flying over the fort at daybreak. He then wrote the poem originally entitled Defense of Fort McHenry which became the U.S. National Anthem in 1931.
- August 2, 1776 In Philadelphia, most of the 55 members of the Continental Congress signed the parchment copy of the Declaration of Independence.

- August 14, 1945 V-J Day, commemorating President Truman's announcement that Japan had surrendered to the Allies.
- American frontiersman Davy Crockett (August 17, 1786) was born in Hawkins County, Tennessee. He was a farmer, scout and politician who perished at age 49 during the final heroic defense of the Alamo in Texas.

Hello from Eastern Star!


