We are rolling along with new degree conferrals. Congratulations to all of our new Entered Apprentice Masons. Your journey has begun!

At the May Stated Meeting, the brothers approved adopting a program that is designed to assist teachers are that more directly affiliated with our lodge. This program is intended to help our affiliated teachers with their operational expenses, that year after year seem to cut into their own personal incomes. And as our fraternity cares deeply about our public schools and is aware of the waining interest in pursuing a profession in teaching, we want to be part of the solution in helping talented and dedicated individuals choose education while easing the burden on some of the costs that get passed onto them personally.

Below is the policy adopted that outlines the eligibility for the program.

NVL#93 Affiliated Teachers Assistance Program Implemented May 3, 2023 Description To assist our affiliated Grade-school teachers with their inherent burden of providing school supplies to their students at their own expense, which only seems to have gotten worse over the years.

The Lodge will allocate up to \$600 annually to each teacher, directly affiliated with our lodge to help cover their operational expenses, according to the eligibility listed below.

Base Eligibility

Masonic Connection: (one or more of the below)

Master Mason in Good Standing (NVL93)

Spouse or legal domestic partner of Master Mason in Good Standing (NVL93)

Female Member in Good Standing of Silverado Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star A majority member in good standing of Napa's DeMolay, Jobs Daughters and/or Rainbow for Girls until age 25.

Teaching Eligibility Institution (all of the below) Teaching in grades K - 12 Public, Charter or non-religious private, or special needs program

Compensation -	
\$600 Annually -	Full-time, fully credentialed teachers
\$300 Annually -	Full-time, teachers assistant
\$150 Annually -	Part-time, teachers assistant or Substitute Teacher

Our intention is to pay out assistance in the July-Aug time frame as our teachers are getting started with the new school year. If you are one of our affiliated teachers and believe you have eligibility based on the criteria above. Please send an email to seanharris007@gmail. com. Please describe your affiliation and eligibility. The Scholarship Committee will review your application and if approved, you will be added to the program and will be notified. The program will run annually, and eligibility will need to be reconsidered each year by the Scholarship Committee as long as the program is still active. Thank you to all of our teachers and all that you do!

The 2023 dues information:

The Grand Lodge approved raising the per-capita payment from \$57.50 to \$60.50 per year, per member.

As a result the 2023 lodge dues are now \$85.50 per year. (\$25+\$60.50)

Our life membership is pro-rated based on age (which is good for older members). Those interested in a life membership should refer to the table below and contact me if you want to convert your membership to lifetime.

\$809.320. LIFE MEMBERSHIP.

A sum of money equal to the Lodge's annual dues at the time of

purchase of the life membership multiplied by the factor indicated opposite the member's age in the following schedule:

Age 49 and under, a factor equal to or greater than 24 times annual dues; **\$2052** 50 to 54 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 20 times annual dues; **\$1710** 55 to 59 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 18 times annual dues; **\$1539** 60 to 64 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 16 times annual dues; **\$1368** 65 to 71 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 14 times annual dues; **\$1197** and Age 72 and over, a factor equal to or greater than 12 times annual dues. **\$1026**

2022 dues cards expired on Dec 31, 2022.
