- January 1, 1776 During the American Revolution, George Washington unveiled the Grand Union Flag, the first national flag in America.
- January 1, 1892 Ellis Island in New York Harbor opened. Over 20 million new arrivals to America were processed until its closing in 1954.
- January 3, 1924 British Egyptologist Howard Carter found the sarcophagus of Tutankhamen in the Valley of the Kings near Luxor after several years of searching.
- January 21, 1954 The USS Nautilus, the world's first nuclear powered submarine, was launched at Groton, Connecticut.
- January 24, 1848 The California gold rush began with the accidental discovery of the precious metal near Coloma during

construction of a Sutter's sawmill. An announcement by President Polk later in the year caused a national sensation and resulted in a flood of "Forty-niners" seeking wealth.

- Birthday Betsy Ross (January 1st 1752-1836) was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. She was a seamstress credited with helping to originate and sew the Stars and Stripes flag of America in 1776.
- Birthday Louis Braille (January 4th 1809-1852) was born in France. Blinded as a boy, he later invented a reading system for the blind using punch marks in paper.
- Birthday Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1791) was born in Salzburg, Austria. From the age of five, through his untimely death at age 35, this musical genius created over 600 compositions including 16 operas, 41 symphonies, 27 piano and five violin concerti, 25 string quartets, 19 masses, and many other works.

I certainly hope you all had a healthy and productive 2023 and are prepared to head into 2024 with renewed enthusiasm.

Dues Information

The per capita assessment for the fiscal year November 1, 2024, through October 31, 2025, as proposed by the Senior Grand Warden, was adopted and fixed at \$65.50. As a result the TOTAL 2024 lodge dues for each member are now \$90.50 per year. (\$25(lodge-dues)+\$65.50)per-capita))

Our life membership is pro-rated based on age (which is good for older members). Those interested in a life membership should refer to the table below and contact me if you want to convert your membership to lifetime.

\$809.320. LIFE MEMBERSHIP.

A sum of money equal to the Lodge's annual dues at the time of purchase of the life membership multiplied by the factor indicated opposite the member's age in the following schedule:

Age 49 and under, a factor equal to or greater than 24 times annual dues; \$2172 50 to 54 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 20 times annual dues; \$1810 55 to 59 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 18 times annual dues; \$1629 60 to 64 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 16 times annual dues; \$1448 65 to 71 inclusive, a factor equal to or greater than 14 times annual dues; \$1267 and Age 72 and over, a factor equal to or greater than 12 times annual dues. \$1086

2023 dues cards expire on Dec 31, 2023.

With iMember 2.0, members can now pay their dues themselves with a credit card online

How to Pay Dues By Credit Card

This new, convenient way to pay dues has been in affect since last year. Here's how it works:

- 1. Log in to the Member Center at member.freemason.org and follow the prompts to "Pay Dues". If members haven't already logged in, all they will need is their member number, lodge number, and email address. The system takes VISA and Mastercard.
- 2. Once paid, the member will be able to download a new dues card immediately.
- 3. Secretaries will be able to see which members have made their payment on a special dues dashboard, which will automatically update Intacct as well, if the lodge is using Intacct.
- 4. Every month, secretaries will receive an itemized report for all of the monies collected. Please note that credit card processing fees are charged to the member.




